Art Department

Animation

Fine Arts Teacher: Sarah Jackson

Grade Range: 6th - 12th Grade

Tuition: \$155 Tuition

Material Fee: \$25

This course teaches students how to make images move and tell stories through animation. Students will explore both digital animation and stop motion, learning skills like planning scenes, creating characters, and building smooth motion. They will create short projects such as animated clips and stop motion videos using simple tools and materials. The course focuses on creativity, storytelling, and hands-on learning.

Art and Geology

Art Through the Alphabet

Material Fee: \$25

A creative exploration of all types of art disciplines (2D to 3D) according to the grade level. Using the alphabet as a starting point, each week will explore an art medium starting with the letter A ending with Z.

Cartooning

Grade Range: 3rd - 12th Grade

Tuition: \$155

Material Fee: \$25

Students learn the foundations of cartoon art through character design, expressive faces, dynamic poses, and simple comic storytelling. By the end of the school year, students will have created original characters and short comics.

Ceramics I

Fine Arts Teacher: Evie Venturini

Grade Range: 3rd - 12th Grade

Tuition: \$155

Materials Fee: \$35

This introduction to ceramics is intended for all grades. They'll learn about pinch, coil, and slab creations, and techniques specific to successfully working with ceramic clay. Students will create functional and beautiful works of art with low-fire clay and glaze.

Ceramics II

Grade Range: 6th - 12th Grade

Tuition: \$155

Materials Fee: \$35

Teacher Recommendation Required

This ceramics class is intended for grades 6th-12th who previously took Ceramics 1. They'll continue to build on the techniques they learned in Ceramics 1- pinch, coil, and slab creations, and techniques specific to successfully working with ceramic clay. Students will create functional and beautiful works of art with low-fire clay and glaze

Cut, Fold, Create: Paper Art

Fine Arts Teacher: Sarah Masker

Grade: 1st - 2nd Grade

Tuition: \$155

Material Fee: \$25

Using paper as the primary medium, students will explore their creativity and express their individuality through a variety of engaging art projects. Through guided demonstrations, they will learn to follow directions while developing foundational skills such as tracing, cutting, gluing, and fine motor control. Emphasis will be placed on both creativity and craftsmanship as students build confidence in their artistic abilities.

Cut, Fold, Create: Paper Art

Fine Arts Teacher: Sarah Masker

Grade: 3rd-5th Grade

Tuition: \$155

Materials: \$25

Working primarily with paper, students will explore techniques such as cutting, folding, layering, and sculpting to transform simple materials into works of art. Students will be encouraged to use their imagination to bring their ideas to life and develop a unique artistic style while completing a variety of hands-on projects. Highlights of the course include scrapbooking, quilling, card making, and papier-mâché.

Digital Arts

Grade Range: 6th - 12th Grade

Tuition: \$155

Materials Fee: \$25

In this course, students create artwork using a variety of digital tools and techniques. They will explore digital drawing and painting, photo manipulation, and basic digital sculpting. Students will learn important art skills like color, shading, and composition while experimenting with different styles. By the end of the course, they will have a portfolio that shows their growth and creativity across different types of digital art.

Forgotten Arts

Fine Arts Teacher: Evie Venturini

Grade Range: 6th - 12th Grade

Tuition: \$155

Materials Fee: \$ 30

Today, most household items are pre-made, mass-produced, and probably made of plastic. Yet there was a time, not so long ago, when industry and artistry blended to create all of our everyday objects. Natural materials were handcrafted into beautiful, functional, and individualized objects that met needs and brought artistic pleasure. Join us as we learn about the “forgotten arts” of everyday life, such as basketry, weaving, batik, tin punching, calligraphy, toy making, and more!

General Industrial Arts

Fine Arts Teacher: Jeff Mutchler

Grade Range: 3rd - 5th Grade

Tuition: \$155

Material Fee: \$50

This course introduces elementary students to the exciting world of industrial arts through hands-on activities, creativity, and problem-solving. Designed for grades 3-5th, the class helps students explore how things are made and how tools and materials can be used safely to build

simple projects. Students will be introduced to basic skills in areas such as woodworking, simple construction, design, and introductory engineering concepts. They will learn how to measure, follow directions, and use age-appropriate hand tools safely and responsibly. Projects may include building small items, creating models, and working with a variety of materials like wood, cardboard, and recycled items. The course emphasizes creativity, teamwork, and perseverance, encouraging students to think critically and solve problems as they design and build. Safety, respect for tools and materials, and good work habits are reinforced throughout all activities.

In addition to hands-on skills, students will be introduced to how everyday objects are designed and manufactured, helping them connect classroom learning to the real world. This course builds confidence, encourages curiosity, and provides a strong foundation for future learning in technology and industrial arts.

General Industrial Arts

Fine Arts Teacher: Jeff Mutchler

Grade Range: 6th - 12th Grade

Tuition: \$155

Material Fee: \$50

This course introduces middle & high school students to the fundamental concepts, skills, and career pathways within the field of industrial arts. Students will explore a broad range of hands-on experiences related to woodworking, metalworking, basic construction, mechanical systems, and manufacturing processes. Emphasis is placed on safe tool operation, proper use of equipment, and the development of problem-solving and critical thinking skills.

Throughout the course, students will learn how to read basic technical drawings, measure accurately, and complete projects using both hand and power tools. Instruction also includes an introduction to materials, fasteners, and common industry practices. Students will engage in individual and group projects that reinforce craftsmanship, creativity, and attention to detail.

In addition to technical skills, the course highlights workplace readiness, including teamwork, communication, and responsibility. Career exploration activities will expose students to opportunities in skilled trades, engineering, and technical fields.

By the end of the course, students will have a foundational understanding of industrial arts, practical experience in multiple trade areas, and the confidence to pursue further study or entrylevel work in technical careers.

Graphic Design

Grade Range: 6th -12th Grade

Tuition: \$155

Material Fee: \$25

In this course, students learn how to create clear and eye-catching designs using digital tools. They will explore basics like layout, fonts, and color while making projects such as posters, logos, and advertisements. Students will practice sharing ideas visually and designing for real-world purposes. By the end of the course, they will have a collection of work that shows their skills and creativity.

Seasons in Art

Grade Range: K- 2nd Grade

Tuition: \$155

Material Fee: \$25

The seasons will be the basis for the Art projects exploring all different types of art disciplines (2D to 3D). Fall, Winter, Spring, and Summer related projects using all the art disciplines.

Sewing

Fine Arts: Sarah Masker

Grade Range: 3rd - 12th Grade

Tuition: \$155

Material Fee: \$30

Students will develop both hand and machine sewing skills through a variety of creative, hands-on projects. Over the course of the year, they will learn a range of techniques, garment mending, and fabric construction while building confidence in their craftsmanship. Emphasis will also be placed on proper sewing machine use and terminology. Donated fabrics will be provided, however, if a student wishes to use a specific fabric, families may choose to supply it.

Sketch and Drawing

Grade Range: 6th - 12th Grade

Tuition: \$155

Materials Fee: \$25

Students learn to draw cool things using lines, shapes, shading, and imagination. Each week brings a new skill and a fun project to help young artists grow confident and creative.

Music Department

Brass Ensemble 1

Fine Arts Teacher: Erik Stiansen

Grade Range: 6th - 12th Grade

Tuition: \$414

This course introduces students to the fundamentals of brass through hands-on experience with brass instruments. Students will learn proper playing techniques, Note reading, ensemble skills, and musicality. Emphasis will be placed on both note accuracy and tonal control through buzzing and breathing on their respective instruments.

This class covers:

- Learning basic notes on a brass instrument
- Basic rhythms and note values in music
- Musicianship within an ensemble

Students will work in a brass ensemble setting, where each player is encouraged to listen to themselves as well as each other as they understand the basics of being a brass instrumentalist. The course is book-based, in the first half of the year, while the second half is focused on applying what they learned as they learn a song together for the spring concert.

Overview

To support the education of each student, the following materials are required at the start of the school year. These items will be used regularly in class and are essential for both in-class participation and at-home practice.

The items have been carefully selected to ensure students can fully engage with all aspects of the course while developing strong musical and technical skills.

Guitar 1

Fine Arts Teacher: Joseph Badalamente

Grade Range: 3rd - 12th Grade

Tuition: \$414 (1hr class)

Curriculum Philosophy (All Levels)

Beyond teaching theory, chords, and scales, this program emphasizes practical application. Students are taught to apply all concepts that are taught by utilizing songs and backing tracks to bring all theory and teaching to life. This makes learning fun and applicable!

Level 1 Guitar Class: Fundamentals & Basics

- Guitar Anatomy & Setup: Identification of parts, tuning techniques, string names, and navigating fret numbers.
- Technique: Proper picking and strumming methods.
- Theory & Foundation: The chromatic scale, finger dexterity exercises, and introduction to open chords.
- Repertoire: Simple songs and essential strumming patterns.
- Theory & Fretboard: Note identification on the neck, sharps and flats, basic rhythm, and chord construction.
- Tabs & Ensemble: Learning to play melodies using tablature and performing in unison with other players.
- Progression: Gradually advancing to more complex musical pieces.

Guitar 2

Grade Range: 4th -12th Grade

Tuition: \$414 (1hr class)

Teacher Recommendation Required

Level 2 Guitar Class: Intermediate Skills

- Advanced Chords: Barre chords, chord extensions, i.e., 7th chord variations (Maj7th, etc.), including their structural makeup.
- Advanced Theory: Chord ordering in any key, understanding the song keys and the chord progressions, i.e., (Major-minor-minor-Major-Major-minor-Diminished).
- Scales & Fretboard Mapping: Major and relative minor scales, using "octave centers" to bridge scale patterns across the entire fretboard.

Musicianship K-1st

Fine Arts Teacher: Rebecca Roman

Grade Range: Kindergarten - 1st Grade

Tuition: \$78 (1/2hr class)

This class builds and develops essential musicianship skills in a fun, interactive setting. Students will engage with quality music selections, drawn from both classical repertoire (as part of a monthly composer study) and well-loved folk and nursery songs to develop their understanding of musical forms and styles and most importantly their enjoyment of music. Skills, including reading and writing music notation, keeping a steady beat, performing melodies and rhythm, ear training, and analyzing the building blocks of music, will be taught in age-appropriate ways through short lessons as well as musical games and exercises and will be built upon systematically each year.

Musicianship 2nd Grade

Fine Arts Teacher: Rebecca Roman

Grade Range: 2nd Grade

Tuition: \$155

This class builds and develops essential musicianship skills in a fun, interactive setting. Students will engage with quality music selections, drawn from both classical repertoire (as part of a monthly composer study) and well-loved folk and nursery songs to develop their understanding of musical forms and styles and most importantly their enjoyment of music. Skills, including reading and writing music notation, keeping a steady beat, performing melodies and rhythm, ear training, and analyzing the building blocks of music, will be taught in age/grade-appropriate ways through short lessons as well as musical games and exercises and will be built upon systematically each year. Students will practice the skills and concepts presented in this course by playing together as a handbell choir, culminating in a performance in the spring concert.

Percussion 1

Grade Range: 3rd - 12th Grade

Tuition: \$414 (1hr class)

This course introduces students to the fundamentals of concert percussion through hands-on experience with snare drums and tom drums. Students will learn proper techniques, rhythm reading, ensemble skills, and musicality. Emphasis will be placed on both rhythmic accuracy and tonal control across multiple Percussion instruments.

This class covers:

- Rudiment development and timekeeping

- Rhythm awareness and musical analysis
- Ensemble performance and listening skills

Students will work in a percussion ensemble setting, where each player is encouraged to listen to themselves as well as each other as they understand the basics of being a percussionist and drummer. The course is book-based, in the first half of the year, while the second half is focused on applying what they learned as they learn a song together for the spring concert.

Percussion II

Grade Range: 4th - 12th Grade

Tuition: \$414 (1hr class)

Teacher Recommendation Required

Percussion 2 is a continuation course designed to expand students' musical understanding through the exploration of various percussion styles and ensemble playing. Throughout the year, students will study and perform music in styles such as rock, pop, jazz, funk, and cinematic percussion.

This class emphasizes:

- Groove development and timekeeping
- Stylistic awareness and musical interpretation
- Ensemble performance and listening skills
- Dynamic control and expression

Students will work collaboratively in a percussion ensemble setting, where each player contributes a unique part to create a full musical experience. The course is performance-based, with students working toward style-specific pieces over the duration of each unit.

Overview

To support our exploration of multiple musical styles, each student is required to have the following materials. These items will be used regularly in class and are essential for both in-class participation and at-home practice.

This kit has been carefully selected to ensure students can fully engage with all aspects of the course while developing strong musical and technical skills (please email the teacher for purchase links).

Required Materials

1. Shakers (Pair)

- Used for: groove development, subdivision, and ensemble layering
- Essential for: pop, cinematic, and rhythm-based styles

2. Tambourine (Half-Moon, Double Row)

- Used for: accents and backbeat reinforcement
- Essential for: rock and pop styles

3. Drumstick Pack

Students should have a complete stick set that includes:

- 5A Drumsticks Primary sticks for general playing across all styles
- Wire Brushes Used for jazz and softer playing styles
- Hot Rods / Multi-Rods Used for controlled dynamics and acoustic textures

Ballet K-2

Grade Range: K - 2nd Grade

Tuition: \$155

Costume: Parent is responsible to purchase for each recital

Basic ballet fundamentals will be introduced and mastered by the end of the year. Basic ballet positions of the arms and feet will be taught, along with basic ballet movements. The children will do a series of exercises to introduce different steps and basic ballet techniques. After this we will do a series of stretches on the floor then across the floor movement. Creative Movement will be woven into the class where the children can experience their own movement and explore how different music makes them feel/move etc. If there is time at the end of class, we may read a ballet story, introduce very basic dance history or watch 5 minutes of a ballet and learn about the culture of the time. The class is geared toward creating a love and appreciation for dance and having fun exploring the beautiful art form. Students are encouraged to show or tell their favorite moves they like to do in their spare time at the end of class. Students will need ballet shoes (girls pink, boys black). Girls must wear tights and a leotard. Girls must also have their hair pulled back from their face in preferably a bun, however a ponytail is acceptable. Boys - regular street clothes are fine but nothing too baggy. No jeans and no heavy jewelry please.

Ballet 1

Fine Arts Teacher: Gabrielle Drivon

Grade Range: 3rd - 12th Grade

Tuition: \$155

Costume: Parent is responsible to purchase for each recital

Basic ballet fundamentals will be introduced and will build off of Basic Ballet. Basic ballet combinations of steps will be taught. The children will do a series of exercises at the barre to

introduce different steps and continue to focus on proper ballet technique. After barre we will do a series of stretches on the floor then across the floor movement. The children will learn two ballet dances per year using music from real ballets. Dancers will start to develop musicality and strength and learn about ballet and its history. Students will need ballet shoes (girls pink, boys black). Girls must wear tights and a leotard. Girls must also have their hair pulled back from the face in preferably a bun, however a ponytail is acceptable. Boys - regular street clothes are fine but nothing too baggy. No jeans and no heavy jewelry please.

Ballet 2

Grade Range: 4th - 12th Grade

Tuition: \$155

Costume: Parent is responsible to purchase each recital

Teacher Recommendation Required

Basic ballet fundamentals will be continued and advanced. This is a course in which is given approval by instructor to students from the previous year. Older dancers will work on the basic fundamentals and will learn a series of barre combinations and center work. Students will be encouraged to watch ballets and learn about specific time periods of ballet history. Students can carry their knowledge of discipline, core strength, flexibility, musicality and endurance in their other activities and daily lives. Dancers will start to develop musicality and strength and learn about ballet and its history. Students will need ballet shoes (girls pink, boys black). Girls must wear tights and a leotard. Girls must also have their hair pulled back from the face in preferably a bun, however a ponytail is acceptable. Boys - regular street clothes are fine but nothing too baggy. No jeans and no heavy jewelry please.

Jazz/Tap

Fine Arts Teacher: Gabrielle Drivon

Grade Range: 3rd - 12th Grade

Tuition: \$155

Costume: Parent is responsible to purchase for each recital

Jazz and Tap fundamentals will be taught in a split time of 30 minutes for each style. Students will learn skills in the center of the dance floor, across the floor with jumps turns or steps, and through a series of combinations. Through upbeat music, precise footwork, and expressive movement, dancers will grow in both artforms while also learning terminology created a century ago. This class is perfect for those who want to sharpen their dance skills and express themselves in a fun and creative aspect. Jazz and Tap shoes will be required and girls must also have their hair pulled back from the face in a bun or a ponytail. Boys - regular street clothes are fine but nothing too baggy. No jeans and no heavy jewelry please.

Modern Dance

Grade Range: 3rd - 12th Grade

Tuition: \$155

Costume: Parent is responsible to purchase for each recital

Modern dance is a free and expressive style of dance that evolved as a rebellion against classical ballet. This course will give the dancers an opportunity to learn the fundamentals of modern dance technique, while exploring new concepts such as breath, weight, fall and recovery, contractions, release, fluidity, space, emotional expressiveness, and suspension. There is no shoe required but they will need to wear attire in which the dancer can move and the instructor can see their lines. Girls must also have their hair pulled back from the face in a bun or a ponytail. Boys - regular street clothes are fine but nothing too baggy. No jeans and no heavy jewelry please.

Kinesthetic Arts

Brazilian Jiu Jitsu

Fine Arts Teacher: Jesse & Justyne Cruz

Grade Range: K -12th Grade

Tuition: \$155

Materials Needed: Parents will be responsible to purchase a gi for the class (approx \$30)

Brazilian Jiu Jitsu is a grappling martial art that derives from Japanese Judo and Jiu Jitsu. In the early 1900's, the Gracie family of Brazil adapted the art to be more applicable in street self-defense situations. Jiu-Jitsu has gone on to develop into the world's premiere self-defense martial art, proving its effectiveness in mixed martial arts competition, such as the UFC. Jiu Jitsu as a martial art has amazing power and potential to build character, provide genuine self-confidence, instill humility, and develop physical fitness. As important as these benefits may be for adult practitioners, they are far more important to the children of our community. We are committed to providing the environment and guidance for the children to thrive in all these areas, while learning practical and effective self-defense.

Our focus in the kids class is to build a rock solid foundation of Jiu Jitsu fundamentals, develop athleticism, and instill a love and appreciation for the art that will stay with them forever. Guided by our core values of Honor, Courage, and Commitment, we look to instill in our students with the focus, discipline, and confidence they need to reach their full potential, and to be the leaders we need for the future.

A typical class will consist of warmups, strength building exercises, and stretching. After warmups the students will receive instruction on Jiu-Jitsu techniques, which they will practice and drill under supervision. Eventually students will be able to participate in live rolling (sparring), which is essential for learning how to practically apply the techniques they've learned against a resisting training partner, giving them the tools and confidence they need to learn true self-defense.
